CONSTITUTION

PREAMBLE

Participation in the Honors Tutorial College (the “College”) is intrinsically a lifetime involvement. People’s roles naturally extend beyond the traditional boundaries of students and teacher, administrators and alumni. Hence, the alumni feel a responsibility to help sustain the vitality of the Honors Tutorial College experience. In this spirit we do hereby found and establish the Society of Alumni and Friends of the Honors Tutorial College.

**ARTICLE I
Name**

The name of this association shall be the Society of Alumni and Friends of the Honors Tutorial College of Ohio University Alumni Association (“Society”).

**ARTICLE II
Mission**

The Society is dedicated to fostering a lifelong relationship of mutual and enduring benefit between the College and alumni and among present and future alumni of the College.

**ARTICLE III
Purposes**

The purposes of the Society are:

1. To enhance the recognition of the College.
2. To assist the College in the recruitment of well-qualified students.
3. To enrich and expand the College experience for current students.
4. To be prepared to advise and consult with the Dean of the College, upon his or her request, on key issues and opportunities identified by the Dean.

ARTICLE IV
Definition of Alumni and Friend

For the purpose of the Society, “Alumni” is defined as all those persons who were enrolled in the Honors Tutorial College at some time in the past, but are not currently enrolled today. This includes both graduates and non-graduates of the College. “Friend” is defined as any person designated by the Dean of the College as a “Friend” of the College for such person’s outstanding assistance, support, and patronage of the College.

ARTICLE V
Board of Visitors

The Board of Visitors shall manage the business of the Society in cooperation with the Dean of the College. The composition of the Board of Visitors, their terms of office, and the manner in which they are elected shall be set forth in the Bylaws.

ARTICLE VI
Bylaws

The power to make, alter, amend or repeal the Bylaws shall be vested in the Board of Visitors. Changes in the Bylaws, as well as resolutions of the Board, shall be approved by simple majority vote of those Members present and voting yea or nay.

ARTICLE VII
Amendments

This Constitution may be repealed or amended at the annual meeting by a favorable vote of two-thirds of those members of the Board of Visitors in attendance. If twenty-five members of the Society so petition the Secretary, changes to the Constitution shall be submitted to the Society at large for ratification by majority of those voting on the matter.
